Aspex is situated in the heart of Portsmouth, bringing art and creativity to a range of audiences across our communities through a varied programme of exhibitions, off-site projects and participation events. As Portsmouth's long-standing Arts Council England, National Portfolio Organisation, contributing to the well-being and cultural opportunities of those in our local community is key to what we do. We work to create opportunities for people of all ages and backgrounds to experience contemporary visual art – from looking and discussing, to making and curating. Working in partnership with other creative individuals in the city helps us to increase our impact, and to this end we are committed to developing our relationship with Lara during the Aspire Programme to further support her practice.

The project builds on previous work developed for Nazar, a VR-based performance that incorporates physical touch to explore intergenerational protection practices. It explores the integration of sensing technology not just as a tool, but as a medium to facilitate the unearthing of knowledge that is stored in the body, centering touch as the main conduit for communication. This approach not only moves away from immersive experiences that typically only engage the visual and auditory, but also challenges the intellectual, affective and physical borders that dominate our contemporary worldview.

Through a development program that will take place at Play Office prior to the residency, I will engage with up to 4 artists to explore best practices for combining sensing technology and embodied practices. As part of the one month residency, I will implement these developments to evolve Nazar from a prototype of a 1:1 performance into a full mixed-reality installation by engaging audiences through a series of activities including workshops, a user-testing of the installation with the workshop's participants, and a showcase open to the public at the end of the residency.
